I'm asking you to make one of your New Year's Resolutions to make every effort to grow in your faith this year. Remember that you are the leader of your child's faith journey. They will totally follow your example. Please make it a good one!

Upcoming classes: January 7th, 21st, 28th. There is no class on January 14th in observance of the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday.

February 4th, 11th. There will be no classes held on February 18th and 25th due to the winter break.

Thank you to all who participated in any or all of our parishes' Advent activities, including Quiet Waters, Lessons and Carols, Lunch with Santa, and the Sodality's or Altar/Rosary Society's Christmas cookie sales. I will update you as soon as I have some dates for Lenten activities.

January 8th, which is also the Feast of the Epiphany or Three Kings is also the day for the children in grades two and three, who will be making either their First Reconciliation or their First Communion to attend Mass with their parents so that the child, the parents, and the parish community can make the commitment to help these children prepare for their sacrament. Families from **Fourteen Holy Helpers should attend the 9:00 AM Mass at Fourteen Holy Helpers** and families from **St. John XXIII will attend Mass at St. John at 10:30 AM. The children will also be receiving the family instruction folder at this time. Due to a shipping error, the books they will use have not arrived and will be given to the children as soon as possible. Remember, it is the parent's role to prepare their child for the reception of the sacraments. We are here to help guide you on your way!**

Epiphany Lessons and Carols will be held on Sunday, January 8th at 4:00 PM. Please join us at Fourteen Holy Helpers Church for hymns and scriptures that lead us from Jesus's birth until His presentation by His parents, Mary and Joseph, at the temple. Let's keep that Christmas spirit going. Remember that the official end of the Christmas Season in the Catholic Church is on the Baptism of the Lord, although some continue to celebrate until the Presentation of the Lord, which is on February 2nd.



Parents of Second grade students and all students preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation need to mark their calendars for Saturday, January 28th, which is the date of the First Reconciliation Retreat. Our sacramental retreats are fun days where the children learn more about the sacrament that they are preparing to receive. It will begin at 10:30 AM and end at 1:00 PM **after regular classes. Reconciliation students must come to class at 9:00 AM.**

Before our retreat begins these children will have a bathroom break and a small snack. One parent or guardian is asked to attend this special event with their child.

Third graders and their parents are asked to be in church no later than 6:00 PM for other activities pertaining to their reception of this sacrament.
